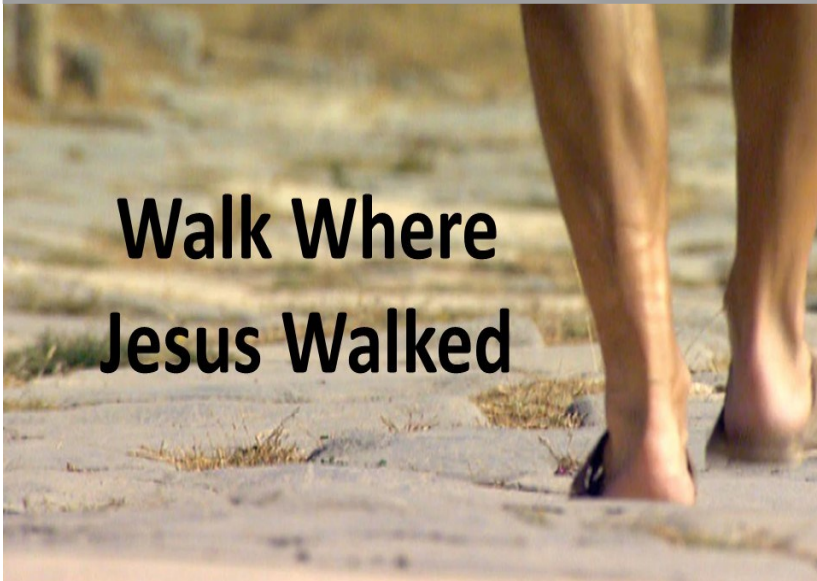
Sermon Series: Walk Where Jesus Walked

Being a Missional Church

In my annual review, the Indiana Conference of the United Methodist Church asked if we are a missional church based on the book, *Shaped by God's Heart*. This book defines a missional church as:

“A reproducing community of authentic disciples, being equipped as missionaries sent by God...” and “A community of believers who trust God and depend on one another.”

It goes on to say that there are mission-minded churches and missional churches. Mission-minded churches 1) Emphasize sending and supporting, 2) use Representatives to do mission, and 3) See mission as one expression of the church's ministry. Whereas Missional churches 1) Emphasize being and doing, 2) Participative in the mission field, and 3) Believe mission is the essence of the church's existence.

There are nine essential practices of missional churches, and they are: 1) Have a high threshold for membership, 2) Be real, not real religious, 3) Teach to obey rather than to know, 4) Rewrite worship every week, 5) Live apostolically, 6) Expect to change the world, 7) Order actions according to purpose, 8) Measure growth by capacity to release, not retain, and 9) Place kingdom concerns first.

But, also according to the book, *Shaped by God's Heart*, it is more than that. It asks if are we transforming people while doing this mission work. Are we working with the people who we serve to help them change their lives for the better, both spiritually and physically? Are we creating relationships with the people we serve and encounter?

In another book, *Not Just a One-Night Stand*, the author says the same thing with the additional twist of adding prayer:

“IT SOUNDS TRITE but it is true: If you want to move from handout to ministry, if you eschew the world of “drive by charity,” if you are ready to stop “playing church” and want to “be the church,” then pray about it. If you belong to a local congregation that wants to make a difference, and you wonder what God has in store for your future, then pray about it. Pray for God to direct your congregation to ministry with, not to, the poor and marginalized. Pray for God to open your eyes and the eyes of your congregation to see those who experience marginalization among you.” [From page 63 of *Not Just a One-Night Stand: Ministry with the Homeless* by John Flowers and Karen Vannoy. Let us strive to be a Missional Church.

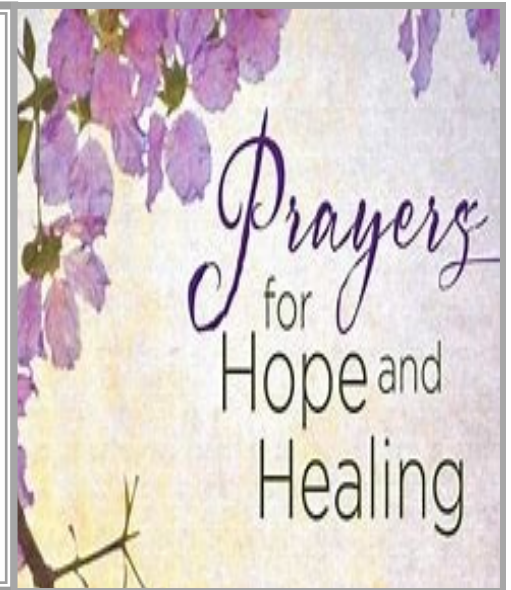

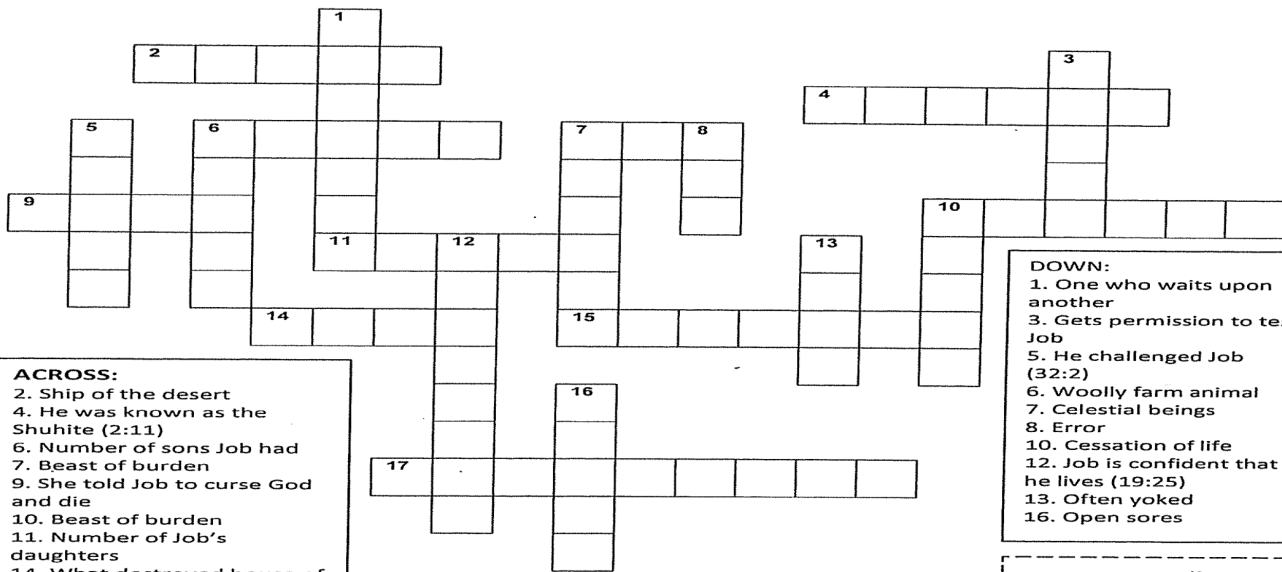
